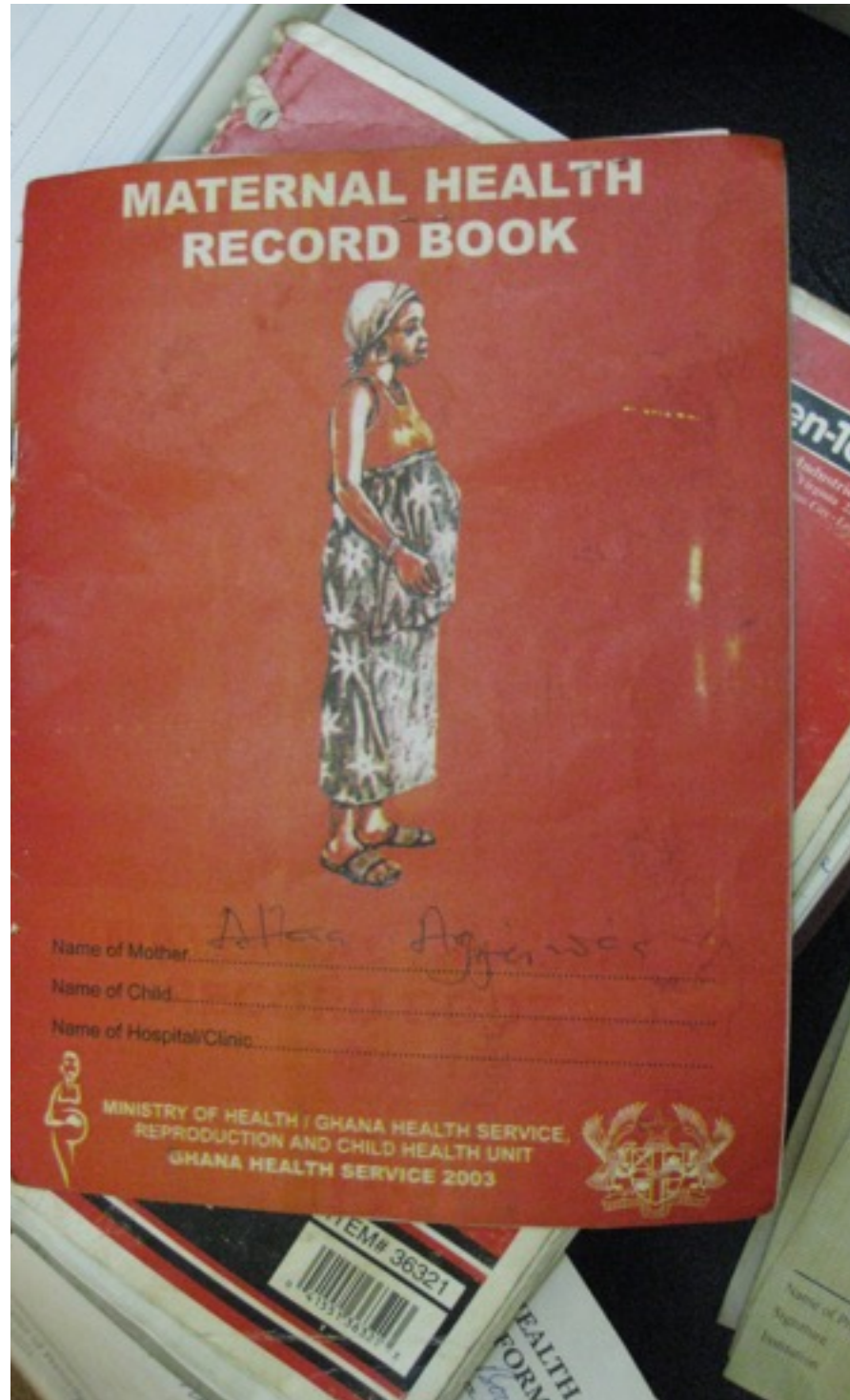

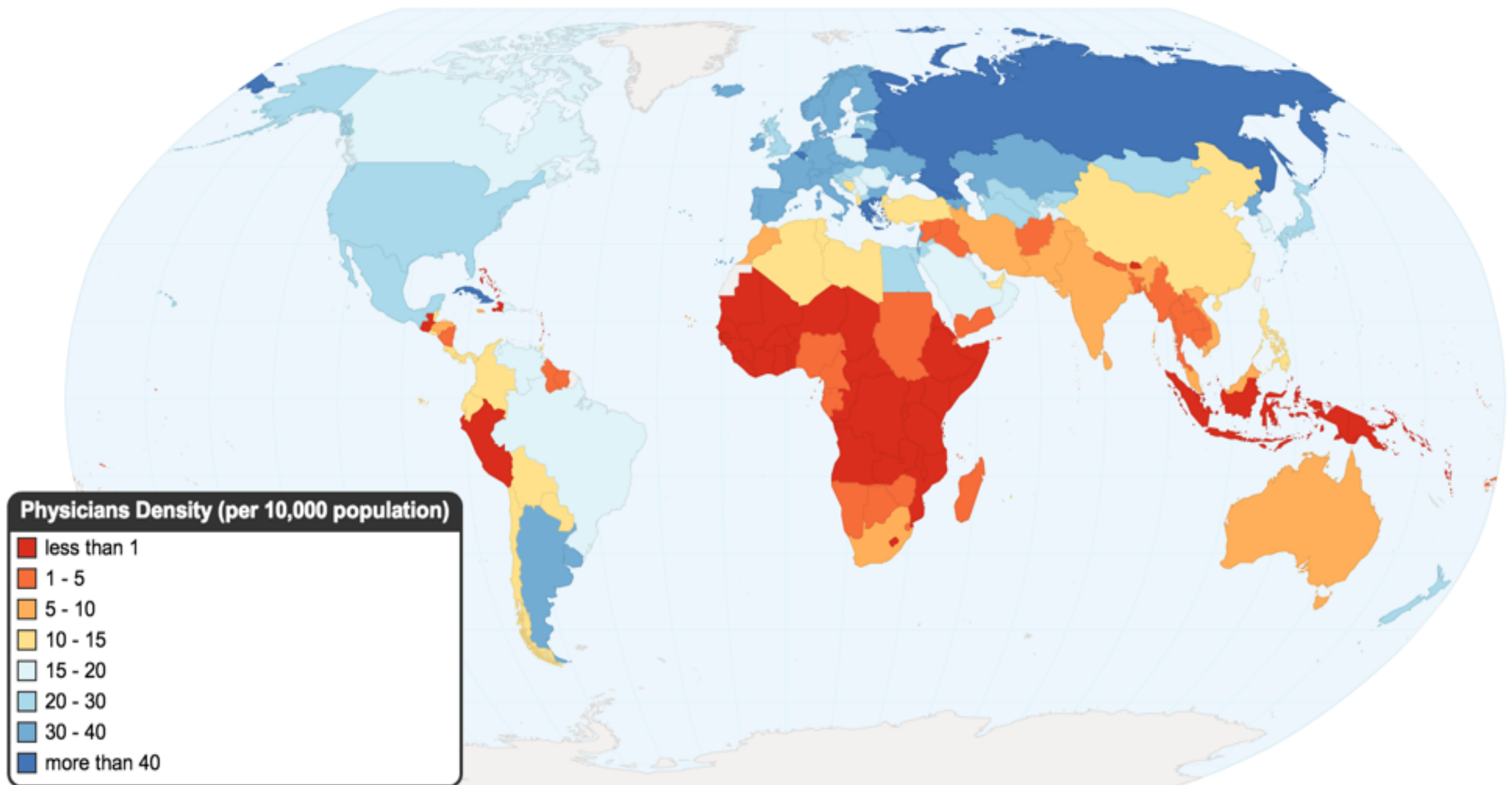

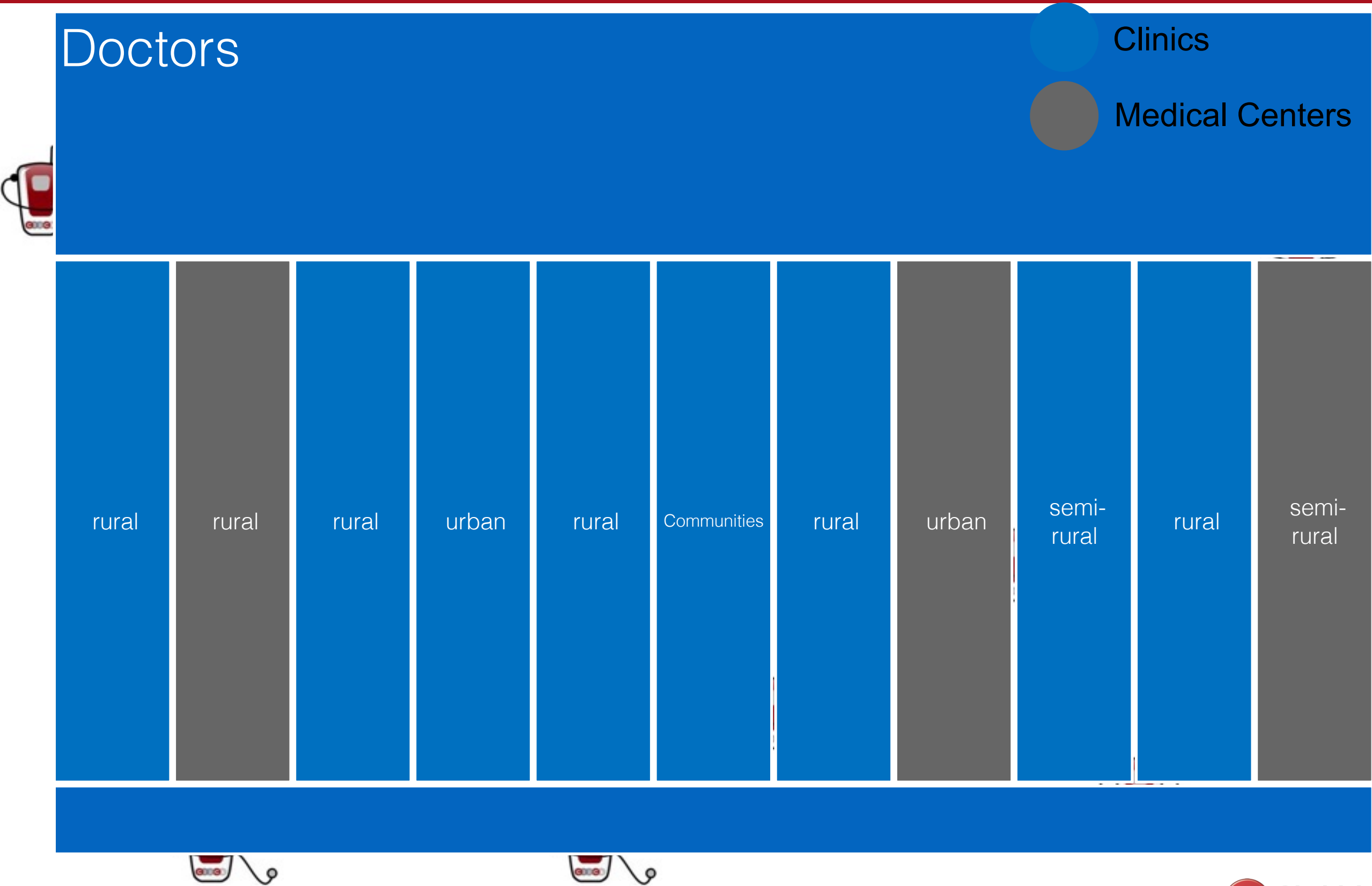

One Oral Surgeon for 1.8 Million People

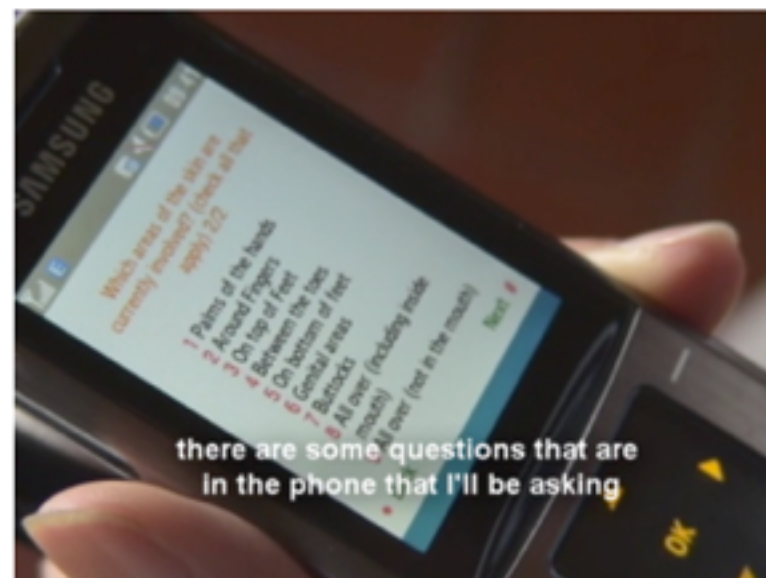






2008: Tele-Consultation (HIV/AIDS, cervical cancer, pre/post oral surgery)

- >\$1M USD saved from transportations per year
- >90 women treated for cervical cancer (in 3 months) through mid-wives screening for cancer



Lessons Learned

1. Health workers, nurses, and caregivers feel empowered to use technology
2. Health provider teams: specialists, doctors, nurses, health workers, and patients have strong need to work together – but can't
3. Bottom-line profit is a top-priority (more revenues / decreased costs)

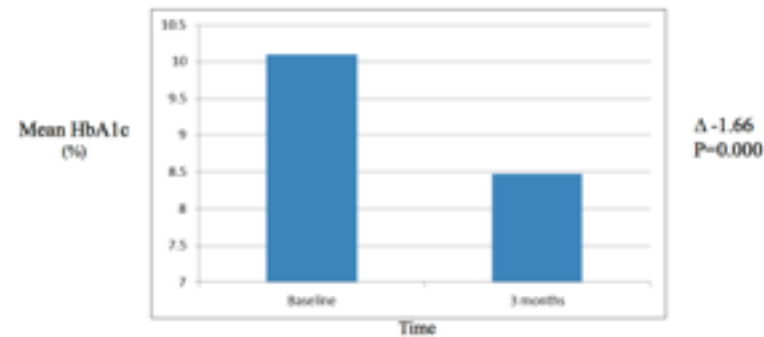
